The data reflect state income guidelines as provided to SPDP as of October 1999; FPL and SMI levels are shown only when provided by the states. One should not assume that states using FPL or SMI guidelines automatically increase the maximum income eligibility limit each year, although FPL and SMI are recalculated on a yearly basis.

\*SPDP has additional information on categories of families guaranteed transitional child care - see Findings in Brief.

\*\*In some cases states that indicated a priority for families transitioning from cash assistance provided policy statements that did not indicate a priority, and it is unclear how prioritization is operationalized in those states.

1. Arkansas transitional child care policy provides subsidy without copayment in the first year, with a sliding fee scale applied in the second and third years.
